how poorly Senators Kassmier and McKamey have been voting. If you haven't paid attention, Montanans voted in 32 Senators who ran as Republicans; however, nine of them have been voting with the democrats giving republicans an effective 23 republican to 27 democrat vote ratio, which means these rogue 9 senators combined with the democrats have been running the show as the remaining 23 Republicans and their leaders look on, powerless to stop them.

McKamey Donates to Democrats

Let this be a lesson to voters on how important it is to elect true biblical, constitutional, conservative Republicans. Cascade County, we need to remember this in 2026 and send these senators and their counterpart

Sen. Wendy McKamey cast a vote against SB 128, a bill designed to prevent county governments from stripping elected clerks and recorders of their election duties during their term. When voters choose an official, they do so with a clear understanding of the responsibilities tied to that role. Allowing another elected official to diminish those duties undermines the trust and intent of the voters. Sen. McKamey's vote against SB 128 is comparable to electing a U.S. President and then stripping them of most of their powers and responsibilities. This would effectively transform the role from a position of leadership and authority to one of symbolic presence, undermining the mandate given by the voters. Sen. McKamey stood out as the sole Republican to side with all Democrats in voting against SB 128—a decision with significant implications for Cascade County, where voters had chosen Sandra Merchant as Clerk, Recorder, and

Election Administrator. Adding to the intrigue, McKamey also contributed to the campaign of Rena Moore Fontana, the Democratic candidate for Cascade Clerk and Recorder running against Sandra Merchant the Republican candidate. Sen. McKamey's decision to vote against SB 128 enabled Cascade County Commissioners Joe Briggs and Jim Larsen to remove election administrator duties from the Clerk and Recorder. 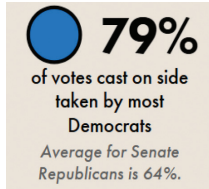

Josh Kassmier, R-Great Falls, got to the Senate by defeating the vice president of the state Republican Party, Lola Sheldon-Galloway, in one of the state's most closely watched GOP primaries. Kassmier was also one of the primary candidates endorsed by Gov. Greg Gianforte last year. Josh is one of the RINO 9 that has given the Democrats control of the Senate. Seems a lot of the RINO 9 were endorsed by Gianforte.

The late-night floor session — coincidentally on Presidents Day — also came after the Legislature's primary bill to renew Medicaid expansion, [House Bill 245](#), narrowly passed a Senate committee by a 6-5 tally Monday. The deciding vote came from [Senate Majority Leader Tom McGillvray, R-Billings](#), who opened the 2025 session warning against Medicaid spending and adding to the national debt.

Moving Medicaid expansion out of the committee appeared to be a concession from Republican leadership on at least one of the most hot-button policy debates this session. Interestingly, all the RINOs from Cascade County are the ones most heavily pushing Gov. Gianforte's Medicaid Expansion Bills. Time to look at campaign contributions made to our Cascade Republicans.

The sponsor of the Medicaid expansion bill, [Rep. Ed Buttrey, R-Great Falls](#), told MTFP that he wasn't sure what moved McGillvray to vote in favor of the bill.
