Montanans weren't even allowed an opportunity to vote for either Rosendale or Sheehy in a primary election. What were the elites afraid of? Aren't the Montana voters supposed to decide who wins a primary by voting for the candidate they deem best?

Well folks, this has been going on a long time. This is exactly why I supported Ken Miller to be our Republican Party chair so many years



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ago. The problem existed back then, and it certainly exists today. You would think if you're a republican running for office you'd automatically get money to make sure you win in the general election but if you're not in the group of the chosen, you might not get a dime for running.

In our last republican primary a complaint was brought to my attention that in Billings, Montana money was being spent by the Billings Republican Party to support Tim Sheehy over Brad Johnson for U.S. Senate.
