is not a defense against the consequences of governmental actions; rather, it leaves you vulnerable to them. Hence, if you do not take an interest in your government, someone else will and then you will be subject to their decisions. This sentiment reflects a core principle of civic responsibility and the dangers of citizen apathy, a concept central to many thinkers, including the Founding Fathers. Fully trust this statement: there is an incredibly large number of very persuasive and politically active *liberals*, and worse, *leftists* who live in your neighborhood, town, state and country who are determined to undermine your rights. They have taken an enormous interest in your government and they are highly organized.

two of the full-blown RINOS in the Montana Senate. There is a total of 7 senators that all seem to be running neck and neck for the *Highest-Ranking #1 RINO* position. Regrettably, there are roughly 9 other senators in the MT Senate who, given a very, very, slight nudge to the left, would be very firmly in the same camp as the aforementioned seven. There are 9 senators that throughout conservative Republican circles in Montana have become known as, “The Nasty Nine”, “The Out of Line Nine”, and a few other terms that ring in a similar way. All 16 senators are clearly leftward leaning on too many issues with regard to the political spectrum, however. Instead of completely pointing fingers, a list of legislators will be provided below for your own scrutiny. It is not the intention of this author to make accusations. Rather, the intent is to develop awareness within citizens who want to vote for those who truly represent the ideals of the Constitution and that are truly representative of an adherence to the Montana Republican Party’s Platform, which includes checks and balances, greater individual freedom, limited government, The Rule of Law, Peace through Strength, fiscal responsibility, free markets, and finally, human dignity because all men are created equal and in the image of God, every human life has inestimable dignity and value, and every person should be measured only by the content of their character.

they call moderate political philosophies but hypothetically transporting them back a few years to the 1990s, would have been considered liberal Republicans. It is only by today's American political standards, which have all digressed to the left, that they are considered moderates. As with a great deal of what goes on in the United States, compromises have taken conservatives to the left along with the rest of the country. Some of those compromises were actually necessities to correct injustices; those were not true compromises. In fact, those necessity pieces



of legislation were by real moral standards for the betterment of mankind that Republicans supported with alacrity. The Civil Rights Act of 1964 was one such piece of legislation. Yes, the bill, H.R. 7152, was authored by a Northern Democrat, Representative Emanuel Celler (NY), but then Democrats filibustered to kill the bill. In historical context, it is noteworthy that there was a 60-days long filibuster created by the Democrat, Senator Richard Brevard Russell, Jr. of Georgia, and carried out by a cadre of Democrats. President John F. Kennedy, also a Democrat, sought out necessary support to pass the bill from the Republican side of the aisle in 1963. Much to the dismay of many, this author included, JFK did not live to see the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. It is also noteworthy that, by today's American political standards, JFK would be considered quite a formidable conservative. JFK makes a very good historical benchmark for knowing exactly how far to the left the country has moved politically in modern times.

Other compromises have been made to *appease* completely irrational movements, and as with just about everything else that gets a foothold, those compromises to appease become tradition; then that first, now established, tradition is built upon to establish further footholds. As all Americans, liberal and conservative, have witnessed, the country continues on its leftward journey, frequently thanks to the so-called *moderates* (who are actually liberals) **appeasement and compromise** in the name of legislative progress. Progress, however, is a very subjective idea. Some of these legislators just want to be successful in bringing legislation to the floor that eventually gets signed by the Governor, simply for the sake of putting a notch on the butt of their legislative rifle; this is regardless of whether the legislation is reasonably expected to improve life for the greater good in the state or, perhaps, even the nation. One thing that anyone with basic research skills can prove is that, over time, everything ratchets leftward over time. For each time the country ratchets temporarily two cogs to the right, it will eventually ratchet six steps to the left. The United States has been that way since its inception. Incrementalism is the mechanism and the Democrats are well aware of its use. The Democrats are winning, and often they are winning through Republican moderation and compromise. As stated above, some of this is necessary to make for an America that is *fair* to as many of our legal inhabitants as possible. However, there is a great

amount of it that is political folderol.

Bearing all of this in mind, let us turn our attention to the Montana House of Representatives. As with the Montana Senate, there is a very similar story to tell: the House has a cadre of RINOS. There are around 10 of them who are unashamedly at the forefront of the race, running neck and neck for the *Highest Ranking #1 RINO* position. In this chamber there are around 15 other Representatives in the House who, as was true with the Senate, given a very, very, slight nudge to the left, would be very firmly in the same camp as the aforementioned 10 Representatives.

What is being stated here is that many of those who campaigned as conservative Republican candidates and were elected on that very premise, are not conservative on issues that mean the most to their conservative-minded constituents. Of course, the now elected official who happens to be a Republican is going to continue to claim to be a conservative because conservatism is the popular philosophical stance that *We the People* so often value. As stated earlier, sometimes even Democratic candidates will throw the conservative card at us in order to gain votes, and some of them may actually be more conservative than the liberal Republican candidate. But constitutional conservatism is not what these *Representatives* uphold and you can prove that to yourself through doing your *homework*. Be certain to look at all of the senators' and representatives' records while doing your homework. As promised above, below are the legislators' names who, in the opinion of this author, deserve your *extra-special attention*. Italicized and bolded names are members of the group that in *actual* moderate and conservative Republican political circles are known as the "*Nasty Nine*" or the "*Out of Line Nine*". In the Montana House of Representatives, their counterparts are known as the "*Friends of the Nine*". They are listed in alphabetical order, not by their *Highest Rank in the Chamber of RINOS*. There are others, especially in the House, who are barely below the RINO RADAR. Become acquainted with the websites below and you will develop a sense for who the true constitutionally conservative and fiscally responsible Republicans are.

Truly moderate Republicans, not the liberal Republicans who are currently claiming to be moderates, are also very desirable because in combination with the conservative Republicans,

they create a valuable tempering of what it is to be a Republican and keep the Montana Republican Party between the two most desirable points on the political spectrum. Do not be fooled by some Republicans who call themselves moderates. Determine their political *moderation* through your own research. Do not simply believe the candidate. *Prove it to yourself*. In our current state of the state, and the state of the nation, the Republican Party cannot afford to promote any candidate who shares a more leftward belief in this state's or this country's politics. Our country is losing cultural traditions, and if you believe that is a good thing, then stop for a moment and think about what happens when the government finally comes after your own cultural traditions.

The legislators named below might ask, "Why am I on this list?" although they already know if they are being honest. The answer to each of them is, "Take a hard look at your voting record, and be honest with yourself." After all, it is not difficult to recognize, as a voting taxpayer, that taxes took more from our individual pocketbooks this year following the legislative session, and *We the People* know who made that possible.
